

ORDINANCE NO. 264.2015 – MILLAGE

**AN ORDINANCE SETTING THE MILLAGE RATE FOR KERSHAW COUNTY
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING
JULY 1, 2015**

Whereas, Kershaw County is authorized under the Home Rule Act and Section 6-1-320 of the South Carolina Code of Laws to set the millage rate for Kershaw County; and

Whereas, any increase of ad valorem taxes for the operation of the Kershaw County school system must be approved by County Council; and

Whereas, Kershaw County collects millage set by the Lugoff Fire District, a Special Purpose District and approved by Kershaw County Council;

Whereas, this ordinance sets, approves, and establishes the millage rates for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2015.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE KERSHAW COUNTY COUNCIL:


1. That the millage rate for the fiscal year commencing on July 1, 2015 for Kershaw County is as follows:

a. County Operating and Personnel Budget	65.8
b. County Debt Service	8.8
c. County Fire District	9.7
d. County Sewer District	2.6
e. County Capital	3.5
2. That upon the request of the Lugoff Fire District, a body politic, and pursuant to the action of the Lugoff Fire District, a body politic, Kershaw County Council approves 25.8 mills as the millage rate for the Lugoff Fire District.
3. That the Kershaw County Board of School Trustees each fiscal year sets a tax levy for operations “provided, however, the board shall not increase ad valorem taxes for the operation of the Kershaw County school system without the approval of a majority of the county council”. That the Kershaw County Board of School Trustees has set a tax levy on ad valorem taxes which provides for an increase in ad valorem taxes for the operation of Kershaw County school system and Kershaw County Council approves a tax levy of 162.9 mills which contains an increase of ad valorem taxes of 4.2 mills as the millage rate for the operation of the Kershaw County school system.
4. The Kershaw County Auditor is directed to levy those millages rates and the Kershaw County Treasurer is directed to collect the taxes.

5. That this Ordinance shall become effective upon the third and final reading.
