**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A REDISTRICTING PLAN  
FOR KERSHAW COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA**

SECTION 1. In compliance with the United States Constitution, the Constitution of the State of South Carolina, Section 4-9-90 of the South Carolina Code of Laws, 1976, as amended, and the United States Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended, the Kershaw County Council has determined to realign the electoral districts for the election of members of Council in accordance with the Federal Decennial Census of 2010.

SECTION 2. There presently exists six single member districts for the election of Kershaw County Council members.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance is for the purpose of defining the boundaries of these six single member election districts.

SECTION 4. The re-defining of the districts boundaries is based upon the 2010 census for redistricting purposes in order that the population of such district shall comply with the requirements set forth in the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended.

SECTION 5. The pertinent demographic data in reference to the proposed districts is attached to this ordinance as Exhibit "A" and is incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth. The six single member election districts for the election of Kershaw County Council members are hereby redistricted to be as depicted on the map attached to this Ordinance as Exhibit "B" and incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth denominated Kershaw County Council Plan 4 with six (6) attached maps denominated Kershaw County Council Plan 4 District 1, Kershaw County Council Plan 4 District 2, Kershaw County Council Plan 4 District 3, Kershaw County Council Plan 4 District 4, Kershaw County Council Plan 4 District 5, and Kershaw County Council Plan 4 District 6 and attachment pages \_\_\_ through \_\_\_ for a detailed description of the Council districts as defined by Public Law from the Census 2010 Geographic Database.

SECTION 6. The County Administrator is authorized and directed to take such administrative actions to promulgate and
